


What's coming next?



DIRECTOR'S NOTES By Lisa Woske

As a young teen, *Gone with the Wind* was one of my favorite movies. I had a six-foot poster of Clark Gable as Rhett Butler hanging on the back of my bedroom door. (I was a somewhat precocious child...!)

From the moment I read the premise of this play through to the last line of the script, I knew I wanted to direct this comedy. That it is largely based on a true story made it all the more appealing!

David O. Selznick did, in fact, shut down filming *Gone with the Wind* and he, Victor Fleming and Ben Hecht did spend days holed up together, fixing and polishing what would be the final shooting script for the movie. And the opening lines of the play? Also true! The way the playwright imagined the story just supports the comic absurdity of that situation; that Hutchinson was able to weave in some social commentary gives the piece some layers.

This play captures the essence of these legendary, larger-than-life Hollywood heavy-hitters in a fond homage to the iconic film that would sweep the Oscars that year and earn its place on virtually everyone's "Top Movies" list.

That I was able to cast my own heavy-hitters to tell this story...I still can't believe my luck. We had such fun creating this romp and Wine Country Theatre gave us such a lovely, supportive playground. Most importantly, we thank each of you for coming out to see local live theatre. Enjoy!
