## **DIRECTOR'S NOTES**

An acting teacher of mine once told me: There's nothing harder in the world than drama....except comedy. Drama requires honesty, work, and commitment. Comedy requires all that....plus timing!

After directing last season's **Of Mice and Men**, I found the prospect of taking on a comedy a breath of fresh air. Also, there are still people mad at me for not warning them about the ending that left us all in tears on that riverbank in Salinas, so there's that too. Fast forward several months (and several bottles of whiskey), to me sitting here now. Let me tell you something: fresh air or not, there's nothing so dramatic as directing a comedy.

The concept for **Noises Off** is simple: Present a play about a company of actors performing in a farce and what happens when their own lives become more farcical than the characters they are playing. However, there is nothing simple about **Noises Off**. For those who may not be familiar with the basic structure of a farce, never fear: **Noises Off** gives us "Farce 101" by allowing us in on Act One to see the play within the play, **Nothing On**. We have doors slamming, sexual high-jinks, mistaken identities, and dropping trousers. It is with our vivid imaginations as audience members that we *assume* what is going on behind all these doors. And then we come to Act Two, and **Noises Off** flips everything around —literally— and we *see* what transpires behind those doors, and in our case backstage. Act Three is all about the fallout, as we return front-side for a much changed version of the script from Act One!

I would like to thank my amazing cast and crew for getting the sardines on, and off, and for making me laugh every single night. Your talent and heart astound me. Thanks to my family for raising me to be familiar with the fun kind of crazy. Thank you to my amazing husband, who not only supports me in all my insane endeavors, but understands why I must do it. And thank you to you — our audience — for the opportunity you give us here tonight. Keep supporting the Arts!

Finally, I ask of you one thing tonight..... forget all about your troubles. Don't think about the economy...Oscar flubs...#fakenews...the future of Shia LeBouf's acting career. Turn off your minds (and phones!!) and sit back to enjoy what many call one of the funniest plays ever written. We dedicate this show to everyone who has ever worked in theater. This show exemplifies why we do what we do including the bruises, tears, and loooooong nights: To share with you – our audience- the greatest gift of all: a laugh. So don't hold back, as Mrs. Clackett says "You'll really enjoy it here!".
