

Director Notes

Welcome to Wine Country Theatre's production of the heartwarming American comedy, Over the River and Through the Woods. Written by Joe DiPietro, the story focuses on Nick, a young Italian-American, and his adoring (and annoying) grandparents. Every Sunday he faithfully goes over the Hudson River to his grandparents' house in Hoboken, New Jersey, for a big Italian dinner. The long-held tradition is disrupted when Nick announces a job change. His grandparents, eager to keep him close by, hatch a scheme to persuade him to stay. As his decision gets closer, Nick faces the tough question, "How much do you owe the people who care for you? How much is enough?" In the process of making his decision, he learns not only how much he is loved by his grandparents, but also how much they mean to him. Speaking about the characters in Over the River and Through the Woods, playwright Joe DiPietro says, "The biggest difference between these generations is their concept of family and home. Our grandparents believed the family was central, and work is something you do just to provide for them. For our generation, it's a lot more complicated." In this smartly-written comedy with dramatic depth, the family navigates these proverbial woods of letting go with love, support and, always, humor! 


Dori Duke as Aida Gianelli
